Key Information

- House Bill (HB) 1842 is comprehensive legislation related to districts, charter schools, and campuses. This chart focuses specifically on campus interventions and the timeline for developing and implementing a campus turnaround (TA) plan to avoid further sanctions by the commissioner [i.e., closure or board of managers (BoM)], resulting from a campus continuing not to meet state accountability standards. **TEA will communicate detailed guidance for developing turnaround plans to districts and charter schools in early 2016.**
- The state accountability rating is based on data from the previous school year (e.g., August 2015 rating is based on 2014-2015 school year data).
- Improvement Required (IR) [intervention requirements, according to Chapter 39](#) of the Texas Education Code, remain in place for campuses with an IR rating. These include the creation of a campus intervention team and campus leadership team who collaboratively develop, implement, and monitor a targeted improvement plan through engaging in the Texas Accountability Intervention System (TAIS) continuous improvement process.
- Additional policies and guidance regarding the campus closure process or the appointment of a board of managers (BoM) to oversee district operations will be forthcoming.
